12th February 2020 to 18th February 2020

As in the past years, this year also 12th February 2020 will be observed as "**Productivity Day**" and the seven days period from 12th February to 18th February 2020 as "**Productivity Week**" throughout the country.

1) 12th & 13th February 2020 (Wednesday & Thursday):-Training Programme on Energy Conservation and Audit at Rudrapur, U.K.:-

Theme: - The verification, monitoring and analysis of use of **energy** including submission of technical report containing recommendations for improving **energy** efficiency with cost benefit analysis and an action plan to reduce **energy** consumption.

2) <u>12th February 2020 (Wednesday):- Training Programme</u> on Productivity Tools and Techniques at Rudrapur, U.K.:-

Theme: - Productivity Tools and Techniques help in eliminating wastage in raw material, wastage of time in case of men and machinery, wastage of space, etc. to improve productivity. Several techniques like work study, statistical quality control, inventory control, operation research, value analysis etc. are used to minimize wastage of resources.

3) 12th & 13th February 2020 (Wednesday & Thursday):-Training Programme on Lean Management at HAL & Ordnance Factory, Kanpur:-

Theme: - Lean Manufacturing is a set of techniques, which have evolved over a long period and are based on various minor to major breakthroughs that help in reducing the cost and hence increase productivity and competitiveness. Main Lean Management techniques include 5 S System, Visual Control, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), Just in Time (JIT), Kanban System (Pull System), Cellular Layout, Value Stream Mapping, Poka Yoke or Mistake Proofing, Single Minute Exchange of Dies or Quick Changeover (SMED), TPM (Total Productive Maintenance), Kaizen Blitz or Rapid Improvement Process; Kaizen, Material Flow Cost Accounting (MFCA).

4) 14th February 2020 (Friday):- Training Programme on Waste Minimization Through 3R Concepts at Kanpur:-

Theme: - The popular and well-known concept of "3R" refers to reduce, reuse and recycle, particularly in the context of production and consumption. It calls for an increase in the ratio of recyclable materials, further reusing of raw materials and manufacturing wastes, and overall reduction in resources and energy used. These ideas are applied to the entire lifecycles of products and services from design and extraction of raw materials to transport, manufacture, use, dismantling/reuse and disposal.

5) 17th February 2020 (Monday):- Training Programme on Circular Economy for Productivity and Sustainability at Kanpur:-

Theme: - A circular economy reduces resource dependency and resource use, including energy thereby reining in production costs, narrowing market exposure and limiting costs stemming from resource extraction and generation. It additionally leads to the introduction of economically viable methods of reducing pollution, and separating harmful from reusable waste material.
