The National Productivity Council (NPC), as India's National Productivity Organization and representative to the Asian Productivity Organization (APO), plays a pivotal role in this transformation. With India assuming the APO Chair in 2025, NPC's influence now extends beyond national borders, with member countries seeking India's expertise in productivity enhancement.

Recently, India welcomed a delegation from Govt. of Thailand who showed deep interest in India's best practices and innovations. In the coming years, India's leadership will expand further, requiring NPC to host, participate in, and lead regional programs. Strengthening institutional capacity, sustained engagement, and adequate resources will be vital to ensure India's continued leadership in productivity up to 2047.

# Tanzania Delegation Study Tour to India on Energy Efficiency

Tanzanian delegation visited India on a study tour focused on energy efficiency initiatives and met the DG and team at NPC HQ on September 11, 2025. They were briefed on NPC's energy management programmes, including the Energy Conservation Act, PAT Scheme, and National Certification Examination for Energy Managers and Auditors. In collaboration with UNDP, NPC expressed readiness to support the Government of Tanzania in developing a national framework and strategy for creating a pool of certified energy auditors and managers.



# \$600 trillion of wealth rests on productivity or inflation burst



Global wealth has soared far beyond economic growth, reaching \$600 trillion, or 5.4 times world GDP, according to McKinsey's latest "global balance sheet." Since 2000, global net worth has nearly quadrupled, but only 30% of the \$400

trillion increase stems from real investment—the rest reflects paper gains and inflation. The top 1% own a fifth of this wealth, deepening inequality. Financial markets remain split between optimism over an Al-driven productivity boom and fears of prolonged inflation from loose fiscal and monetary policies. Tech stocks and gold have both surged, highlighting investor uncertainty. McKinsey warns that when asset values rise faster than GDP, excessive leverage and buybacks replace productive investment, leaving economies vulnerable. Global debt now equals 2.6 times GDP, raising concerns about sustainability. The future depends on whether productivity accelerates to realign wealth and growth or inflation persists, eroding real assets and stability. For U.S. savers, this could mean a \$160,000 swing in wealth by 2033—underscoring how today's choices will define tomorrow's prosperity.

## Global Economic Outlook Shows Modest Change Amid Policy Shifts and Complex Forces

In April, the U.S. disrupted global trade norms by announcing unilateral sweeping tariffs. Six months later, the global growth downgrade remains modest, thanks to trade deals, exemptions, and minimal retaliation. Private sector agility helped offset shocks, with global growth now projected at 3.2% in 2025 and 3.1% in 2026. However, risks persist as high tariffs, tight immigration policies, and rising inflation weigh on recovery. China's weaker currency, redirected exports, and fiscal support, along with Germany's fiscal expansion and resilient emerging markets, have cushioned the impact. Yet, the outlook remains fragile. Risks include an AI investment bubble, China's property sector struggles, mounting fiscal pressures, and weakening institutional credibility. These challenges threaten productivity and stability, with potential global output losses of 0.3% next year. Despite resilience, sustained trade tensions and policy uncertainties continue to cloud the global economy, demanding vigilance, cooperation, and prudent fiscal and monetary management.

The programme also included site visits to CoE on Smart Manufacturing and a few SME units.

# **APO sponsored India-Thailand Bilateral Cooperation on Digital Manufacturing Excellence**



CoE:IT for I4.0, NPC hosted the APO-sponsored Bilateral Cooperation between NPOs (BCN) on Digital Manufacturing Excellence from Thailand to India, held on 4-6 August 2025. The program aimed to share best practices on leveraging India's smart factory innovations and Industry 4.0 implementation.

The Thai delegation, comprising senior officials from the Ministry of Industry and Thailand Productivity Institute (NPO Thailand), gained valuable insights into India's approach to industrial digitalization through strategic meetings and site visits.

The BCN mission successfully met its objectives, deepening mutual understanding and fostering collaboration between NPC-India and NPO-Thailand. It has paved the way for future partnerships focused on productivity enhancement, technology adoption, and digital transformation.

The visit also provided Thailand an opportunity to understand India's proven strategies for manufacturing excellence.

### Indian Exporters Advised to Leverage India–UK CETA for Growth, MSMEs **Urged to Tap New Markets**

The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), Regional Authority Delhi, under the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, organised an outreach programme on the India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. Themed "Gateway to Growth: Harnessing Opportunities under India–UK CETA," the event brought together senior officials, diplomats, Export Promotion Councils (EPCs), and industry leaders to explore trade opportunities. DGFT & Additional Secretary Shri Ajay Bhadoo highlighted CETA's potential to enhance exports through tariff concessions, easier market access, and MSME participation in global value chains. Joint Secretary Shri Saket Kumar and UK Deputy Trade Commissioner Ms. Anna Shotbolt stressed the Agreement's strategic and sustainability aspects. Sectoral heads from APEDA, FIEO, ESC, SEPC, GJEPC, EPCH, EEPC, and AEPC discussed opportunities in agriculture, IT, engineering, textiles, and creative sectors. The session concluded with buyers and institutions like UKIBC and HSBC emphasising resilient supply chains and DGFT reaffirming support for exporters.

### Ministry of MSME celebrated 'MSME Seva Parv-2025: Virasat se Vikas' from 28th-30th September 2025 at Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh

The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) celebrated MSME Seva Parv 2025: Virasat se Vikas from 28th-30th September 2025 at Rudraksh International Cooperation & Convention Centre, Varanasi. The event promoted heritage, cultural pride, and community participation in MSME development. The celebration was inaugurated by Union Minister Shri Jitan Ram Manjhi, with Minister of State Sushri Shobha Karandlaje as Guest of Honour. Senior dignitaries from the Government of India and Uttar Pradesh, over 1,500 beneficiaries of MSME schemes—including PM Vishwakarma, PMEGP, Khadi & Gramodyog, and NSSH participated. Highlights included a Swachhata Karyakram at Namo Ghat, MoU exchange between KVIC and NSIC, and distribution of loan certificates, subsidies, and toolkits. A Mahila Paricharcha session engaged women entrepreneurs and SHGs. The PM Vishwakarma Scheme, launched in 2023, has registered 30 lakh artisans, provided 23 lakh skill trainings, and disbursed ₹4,331 crore in loans. The NSSH Scheme has empowered 1.5 lakh SC/ST entrepreneurs, achieving a 36fold rise in public procurement. The Khadi sector saw 47% growth in production, while PMEGP has generated 86.5 lakh jobs through over 10 lakh enterprises.

## Stakeholder Consultation held by NPC, New Delhi on 24.9.2025 to identify infrastructure requirements of Gazipur Wholesale Fish Market

Consultation was held on 24.09.2025 amongst officers of the Agribusiness Group, NPC, Delhi Agricultural Marketing Board, and stakeholders of the Gazipur Wholesale Fish Market to assess infrastructure needs for developing a modern wholesale and retail facility. The market, managed by the Delhi Fish, Poultry and Egg Marketing Committee, trades fish from several states and operates under the Board with 252 shops. Infrastructure needs exceeding ₹100 crore were identified. Discussions also covered quality control, hygiene, SOPs, pricing, and handling



practices. The consultation was part of NPC's study for the Department of Fisheries, Government of India.

## **Sagarmala Scheme Evaluation Study**



The Industrial Engineering Group conducted an Evaluation Study of the Sagarmala Programme, commissioned by Sagarmala Finance Corporation Limited (SMFCL) under the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Government of India. Launched in 2015, Sagarmala aims to promote port-led development by leveraging India's 7,517 km coastline to reduce logistics costs for EXIM and domestic trade through optimized infrastructure investment.

The study evaluated implementation and monitoring mechanisms, identified challenges, and assessed socio-economic and

environmental impacts. Using stratified random sampling, 20 projects were selected across four pillars—Coastal Community Development, Coastal Shipping & Inland Water Transport, Port Connectivity, and Port Modernization—covering all 11 coastal States and Union Territories. NPC teams conducted field evaluations, consultations, and data collection with implementing agencies and stakeholders. The final report presented project-wise findings, key bottlenecks, and actionable recommendations to strengthen programme outcomes and enhance efficiency in achieving Sagarmala's port-led growth vision.

## NPC HQ Organized 5-Day Lean Manufacturing Consultants (LMC) Training Programme under MSME Competitiveness Lean Scheme (MCLS) of Ministry of MSME from 22-26 Sep 2025 at Manthan Hall, NPC, New Delhi

The National Productivity Council (NPC) organized a 5-day Training Programme for Lean Manufacturing Consultants (LMCs) from 22nd–26th September 2025 at Manthan Hall, NPC HQ, New Delhi. Attended by 20 participants from diverse sectors, the programme aimed to strengthen consultants' capacity to enhance productivity and competitiveness in MSMEs under the MSME Competitive (Lean) Scheme. Expert facilitators including Sh. Ashutosh Makup, Sh. Sanjay Dwivedi, Sh. Siddharth Pal, and others conducted sessions on key Lean tools such as 5S, Kaizen, TPM, Value Stream Mapping, JIT, SMED, and 7QC tools, along with insights on the MCLS scheme. The programme concluded with an assessment and



discussions on preparing diagnostic study reports and implementation plans for MSMEs, equipping participants with practical knowledge to effectively drive Lean interventions and support continuous improvement initiatives across the MSME sector.



• Chennai Port Authority (ChPA), an all-weather port, engaged NPC Chennai to develop an Oil Spill Contingency Plan based on the National Oil Spill Disaster Contingency Plan (NOS-DCP 2015) and OISD guidelines. The plan aims to coordinate effective response to major spills within coastal state limits using regional resources. NPC Chennai also inspected the availability and condition of oil spill response equipment at ChPA. In addition, a Quantitative Risk Assessment was carried out to identify hazards and risks in handling IMDG Class 1 cargo at the coastal berth, with suitable

mitigation measures proposed.




